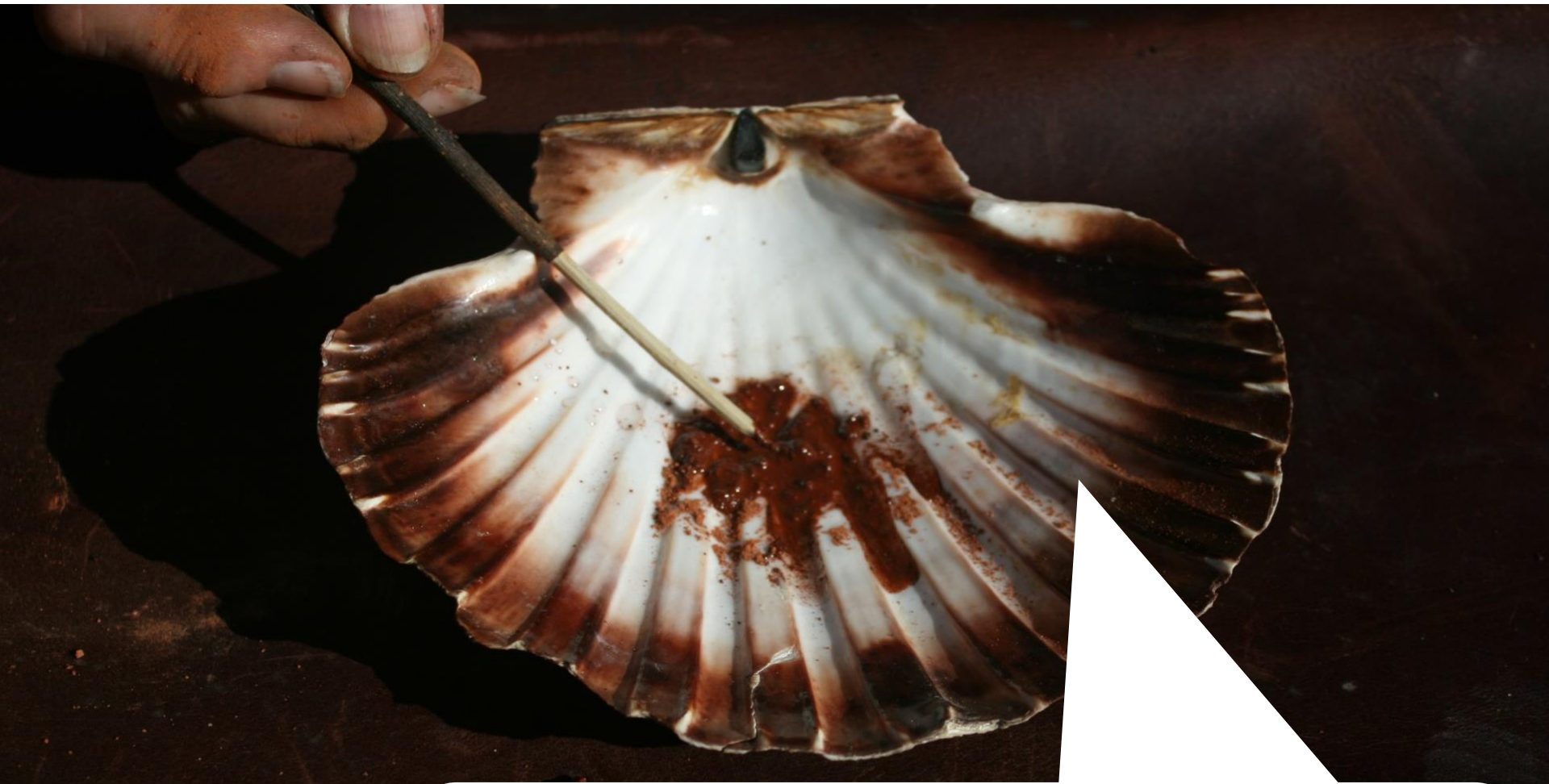


A gentle
